

The World of Papa Hambone

with George Vukelich 7 PM til Midnight Monday thru Friday

Papa Hambone, George Vukelich, joined WIBA Radio in 1960. Since then, something essential happens at night on WIBA with Hambone.

From an essentially jazz and poetry format 15 years ago, the World of Hambone expanded its horizons with the changing times, pioneering such talk series as "Conversations with the Candidates" — live interviews with candidates for political office ranging from local to presidential; "Viewpoint" — with guests ranging from Attic Angels to Zen buddhists; "Alcoholics Anonymous on the Air" — 13 2-hour programs — the first time AA has ever aired actual AA

— the first time AA has ever aired actual AA meetings on the radio; and one of the most widely discussed of any local series ever, the controversial "Vietnam Seminar."

Hambone also produces and narrates the annual Christmas series, "Last Letters from Stalingrad" — now in its 13th year, and Anchor Savings weekly half hour program, "North Country Notebook" — now in its 3rd year.

Off the air, Papa Hambone is active in civic and conservation affairs; he is book editor of Madison's evening paper, The Capital Times; he fishes—rain or shine, summer or snow, and is a published novelist, poet and journalist.
